#### **Background**

The G20 first committed to addressing the global refugee crisis at the 2015 G20 Summit in Antalya. By that time, worldwide displacement had reached an ultimate high of approximately 59.5 million persons displaced.<sup>2148</sup> The cause of mass migration was widespread war, conflict, and persecution in Africa, the Middle East, and Asia. Thus in 2015, the G20 committed to strengthening support to provide protection for refugees and internally displaced persons (IDPs).<sup>2149</sup>

At the 2016 Hangzhou Summit, G20 leaders continued to address the global refugee crisis and recognized that migration numbers had reached a scale unseen since World War II.<sup>2150</sup> In Hangzhou, G20 leaders recognized the potential for mass migration to challenge the future of global economic growth and thus reiterated their support for addressing the root causes of displacement, protecting

refugees, and creating a better system of shared responsibility.<sup>2151</sup> They also called for "strengthening humanitarian assistance for refugees and refugee resettlement."<sup>2152</sup>

Two years after the G20 made its first commitments in response to the global refugee crisis, massive influxes of refugees and migrants continue to affect G20 members. While old crises are still unfolding, new humanitarian disasters are emanating. In June 2017, the UN High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR) reported that by the end of 2016, 65.6 million individuals were forcibly displaced worldwide.<sup>2153</sup>

Thus at the 2017 Hamburg Summit, G20 leaders recognized the main drivers of forced displacement to be conflicts, natural disasters, and human rights violations and abuses.<sup>2154</sup> In particular, they acknowledged that irregular migration and forced displacement poses many complex challenges for countries of origin, transit, and destination, and that safe, orderly and regular migration can lead to substantial social and economic benefits.<sup>2155</sup> While G20 leaders reiterated old commitments to address the root causes of displacement, they also made new, unprecedented promises to address migration. In the "Leaders' Declaration," the G20 committed to counter migrant smuggling and trafficking and increase the promotion of economic development in countries where displacement occurs.<sup>2156</sup> They also stressed the particular importance of addressing the distinct needs of refugees and migrants and enabling refugees and migrants to return home safely when it is possible.

#### **Commitment Features**

The G20 committed to "addressing the distinct needs of refugees and migrants, in particular close to their region of origin and, when applicable, to enable them to return home safely."

It is important to distinguish between refugees and migrants. Migration is a "movement that takes place outside the regulatory norms of the sending, transit and receiving countries."<sup>2157</sup> It may be an internal movement within a country. However, it also can, but does not require, the crossing of international borders. Migrants refer to those "who move across an international border or within a State away from his/her habitual place of residence"<sup>2158</sup> and include asylum seekers, refugees, and IDPs.<sup>2159</sup> A refugee is "someone who has been forced to flee his or her country because of persecution, war, or violence"<sup>2160</sup> and "has a well-founded fear of persecution for reasons of race, religion, nationality, political opinion or membership in a particular social group."<sup>2161</sup> In contrast, an

asylum seeker is someone who has similarly experienced persecution in their country of origin and is waiting to gain asylum or refugee status into a safe country. <sup>2162</sup> Further, IDPs are "persons or a group of persons who have been forced or obliged to flee or to leave their homes or places of habitual residence" <sup>2163</sup> due to or in order to avoid armed conflict, generalized violence, violations of human rights or natural disasters. <sup>2164</sup> Unlike refugees, they have not crossed an internationally recognized State border to find safety. <sup>2165</sup> Given that refugees thus are a sub-category of migrants, and that the term "migrant" additionally includes asylum seekers and IDPs, this commitment will refer to "migrants" rather than "refugees and migrants" for the sake of simplicity.

"Addressing the distinct needs of refugees and migrants" refers to the unique needs of migrants in light of their circumstances. These needs are specific to migrants and are a direct result of their particular circumstances. These can include basic needs such as access to food, water, and shelter as well as more complex needs such as psychological, economic, or legal support. Many have undergone traumatic experiences, been exposed to violence, become dependent on external support, and have limited economic opportunities to rebuild their livelihoods. <sup>2166</sup> Providing these needs is thus humanitarian in nature and requires a multi-sectorial response.

Furthermore, supporting migrants who are "close to their region of origin" implies a particular emphasis on addressing the needs of migrants who are currently located near their country of origin, which is either inside or near the territory of a G20 member. This commitment is therefore divided into two components: taking concrete and tangible actions at the 1) domestic level and 2) international level, to provide address the distinct needs of migrants.

#### **Part One: Domestic Actions**

In taking domestic action to meet the distinct needs of migrants, members must support the resettlement needs and provide support for migrants in their own jurisdictions. This implies that refugees must receive the rights they are entitled to according to the 1951 UN Refugee Convention, including economic and social rights, and should have "access to medical care, schooling and the right to work." Other migrants, such as asylum seekers, must also be subject to fair asylum procedures. G20 members could provide "services to facilitate [refugee] integration, such as cultural orientation, language and vocational training, as well as programmes to promote access to education and employment." Other examples could also include supporting psychological services, enhancing opportunities for employment, and providing educational opportunities for refugee children, and enhancing refugees' equal and fair access to justice in a court of law, among others. #### Part Two: International Actions

Members can also take action to meet the distinct needs of migrants on an international level by providing humanitarian and/or financial assistance and other forms of support to host countries, migrant populations abroad, or other organizations including UNHCR and non-governmental

organizations (NGOs) who are working to meet the needs of migrants. Taking international action thus encompasses supporting programs to provide access to clean water, food, and adequate shelter for migrants, as well as providing health, psychological and educational services. Members can also provide support for refugee resettlement efforts and assist other countries develop a great capacity to offer protection.

"When applicable, to enable them to return home safely" implies efforts allowing for the return of migrants to their countries of origin when it is justifiable and safe to do so. Enabling their safe return is an international action in nature as it involves the crossing of national borders. Furthermore, facilitating migrants' return to their countries of origin also counts towards meeting their distinct needs by helping to resettle them at home.

According to the Refugee Convention, "no Contracting State shall expel or return refugee in any manner whatsoever to the frontiers of territories where his life or freedom would be threatened on account of his race, religion, nationality, membership of a particular social group or political opinion."<sup>2170</sup> Refugees must "return in safety and with dignity to their country of origin and re-avail themselves of national protection."<sup>2171</sup> Hence, the option to return home must be voluntary in nature. Assisted voluntary return is the "administrative, logistical, financial and reintegration support to rejected asylum seekers, victims of trafficking in human beings, stranded migrants, qualified nationals and other migrants unable or unwilling to remain in the host country who volunteer to return to their countries of origin."<sup>2172</sup> Actions to enable the safe return include offering specialized assistance and services to migrants in situations of vulnerability, facilitating travel documentation, assisting with travel arrangements and contributions to and cooperation with assisted voluntary return programs operated by external organizations.<sup>2173</sup> Other aspects include "public assurances of personal safety, integrity, non-discrimination and freedom from fear of persecution or punishment upon return, physical safety protection from armed attacks" and access to land or means of livelihood."<sup>2174</sup>

Enabling the return of migrants to their homes without satisfying the above criteria will thus be counted negatively towards compliance. This includes failing to facilitate their return when it is applicable to do so or facilitating their return when it is not applicable to do so. Furthermore, when it is not applicable to enable migrants to return home safely, G20 members must support their local integration and resettlement instead.

To achieve full compliance, G20 members must take concrete action to address the distinct needs of migrants both domestically and internationally. When applicable, G20 members must also take steps to enable their safe return home in order to fulfill the international aspect of the commitment.

#### Argentina: +1

Argentina has fully complied with its commitment to address the distinct needs of refugees and migrants, in particular close to their region of origin and, when applicable, to enable them to return home safety.

As of 2 October 2017, the Argentine government received 62 income permit requests for the second 2017 semester in progress for the Syria Program.<sup>2175</sup>

On 10 November 2017, the Ministry of Interior and Transport enhanced the Syria Program to include 100 more humanitarian visas, reaching a total of 420 visas granted for Syrian refugees. The program was initially created on 14 October 2014, and granted special visas for 3,000 Syrian refugees. Refugees first receive temporary and renewable residence permits, which can become permanent after two years. The humanitarian visa entitles refugees to the same social services as national citizens, including access to job opportunities and education, with the option to voluntarily return home when conditions allow, or to become self-reliant in Argentina.

On 14 December 2017, Argentina hosted a forum on Migration, Trade, and the Global Economy. <sup>2180</sup> The event was co-held by the International Centre for Trade and Sustainable Development and

International Organization for Migration to promote a better understanding of the link between migration and international trade.<sup>2181</sup>

As of 15 December 2017, Argentina accepted a total number of 155 people under their Syria Program in 2017, the largest number of refugees since its launch in 2014.<sup>2182</sup> Almost half of them have been received as of December 2017.<sup>2183</sup>

In 2017, Argentina contributed USD113,900 to the UN High Commission for Refugees (UNHCR).<sup>2184</sup>

As of January 2018, President Mauricio Macri extended the Syria Program's validity for another year. <sup>2185</sup> The priorities for 2018 are focused on supporting the private sector and strengthening the institutions in charge of the program's functioning. <sup>2186</sup>

Argentina has taken steps to address the distinct needs of migrants through both concrete domestic and international actions, by strengthening domestic programs like the Syria Program, and sustaining existing international initiatives with continued funding contributions to the UNHCR.

Thus, Argentina receives a score of +1.

#### Australia: 0

Australia has partially complied with its commitment to address the distinct needs of refugees and migrants, in particular close to their region of origin and, when applicable, to enable them to return home safety.

On 5 September 2017, the Migration Amendment (Validation of Decisions) Bill was passed, allowing for the rejection of visas or applications for one based on character grounds informed by the use of protected information.<sup>2187</sup> These grounds include the commitment of serious crime, posing a risk to safety, or threatening Australia's national interest.<sup>2188</sup>

On 30 October 2017, the Border Force Amendment (Protected Information) Bill was passed, which amended the definition of 'protected information' so that only information that is harmful to national or public interest is protected.<sup>2189</sup> Moreover, this amendment is backdated to the original enactment period of the 2015 Australia Border Force Act, which allows those who work in places like the Nauru or Manus Island detention centres the ability to speak on their conditions without fear of prosecution.<sup>2190</sup>

On 31 October 2017, the Manus Island detention centre was closed by the Australian government following a court ruling in Papua New Guinea. The centre had been used to process migrants who arrived by boat in Australia without proper documentation, and a similar centre on Nauru remains open. During the previous month, the Australian government compensated nearly 2000 people detained at the Manus Island detention centre over claims of physical and psychological injuries. Both centres have been criticized for inadequate conditions due to a lack of sufficient facilities and for exposing individuals to harm. A number of migrants from the facility in Manus refused to leave and were subsequently forcibly evicted from the centre. The United Nations High Commission for Refugees (UNHCR) has criticized conditions in the new centres as lacking basic minimum standards. However, migrants at the centres have been provided consideration to resettle to the United States, a number of which have already been accepted.

In 2017, Australia contributed USD39.7 million the UNHCR.<sup>2197</sup>

As of 28 February 2018, Australia has provided the UNHCR with USD26 million in funding in 2018.<sup>2198</sup> Other international aid includes funds directed toward the World Food Programme, International Committee of the Red Cross, and UN Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian

Affairs.<sup>2199</sup> Resources allocated to the Humanitarian and Refugee Program help provide for refugee and humanitarian visas, though those who arrived by boat after 2012 are generally denied access to these visas.<sup>2200</sup> The 2018 budget provides funds for settlement services which include counselling, language training, and job skills.

Australia has implemented some measures that address the needs of migrants internationally and domestically through aid and funding of specific programs. However, the policies in place directed at migrants who arrive by boat and the conditions under which they are detained do not meet the standards set by the commitment.

Thus, Australia receives a score of of 0.

#### Brazil: +1

Brazil has fully complied with its commitment to address the distinct needs of refugees and migrants, particularly close to their region of origin and, when applicable, to enable them to return home safety.

On 19-20 September 2017, the Ministry of Justice and Public Security hosted the first International Seminar to Combat Trafficking of Persons and Smuggling of Migrants with the support of the European Union and the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime.<sup>2201</sup> The event convened members of government institutions, civil society and representatives of other countries collaborating with Brazil to combat the crime.<sup>2202</sup> International organizations such as the EU, International Organization for Migration, UN Children's Fund and UN Development Programme also participated in the seminar.<sup>2203</sup> The seminar provided an opportunity for participants to share experiences, best practices and data on the subject and to contribute to the development of Brazil's 3rd National Plan to Combat Trafficking in Persons.<sup>2204</sup> The seminar also enabled the collection of subsidies to begin the construction of the plan, which will be implemented from 2018 to 2021.<sup>2205</sup>

On 21 November 2017, the Government of Brazil implemented a new migration law that grants visas for stateless persons or those arriving in Brazil due to a situation of imminent institutional instability, armed conflict, environmental disaster, violation of human rights or violation of

international humanitarian law in their home countries.<sup>2206</sup> Chief of Staff of the National Secretariat of Justice Bernardo Laferté commented that the new law actualizes the provisions of Article 5 of the federal constitution, which prohibits discretionary distinctions between Brazilians and foreigners.<sup>2207</sup>

In 2017, Brazil contributed USD662,778 to the UN High Commission for Refugees (UNHCR).<sup>2208</sup>

On 6 February 2018, the Ministry of Justice and Public Security announced that asylum seekers will receive identification documents beginning in October 2018. <sup>2209</sup> The identification documents reaffirm the rights of asylum seekers and will further facilitate access to the rights already guaranteed to them, including access to public services such as health, education, and social assistance. <sup>2210</sup>

On 8 February 2018, Minister of Defense Raul Jungmann announced that the Brazilian government will relocate tens of thousands of Venezuelan refugees and increase aid to hundreds of thousands of people who fled Venezuela.<sup>2211</sup>

On 8 February 2018, Minister of Justice Torquato Jardim stated that the Brazil would implement procedures within 90 days to revalidate the diplomas of Venezuelan migrants.<sup>2212</sup> This would allow Venezuelan migrants with higher education to integrate into the Brazilian labour market.<sup>2213</sup>

On 15 February 2018, Brazil adopted measures to address the influx of Venezuelans, including creating a federal assistance committee, and a series of measures aiming to to improve social protection, health and public safety in municipalities overwhelmed by the influxes.<sup>2214</sup>

Brazil has fully complied with its commitment to address the needs of refugees and migrants by taking domestic actions. It has also taken international action by financially supporting the UNHCR.

Thus, Brazil receives a score of +1.

#### Canada: +1

Canada has fully complied with its commitment to addressing the distinct needs of refugees and migrants, close to their region of origin and, when applicable, to enable them to return home safely.

On 4 October 2017, Minister of International Development and La Francophonie Marie-Claude Bibeau announced that the Government of Canada would contribute CAD3 million in response to an appeal from the United Nations and International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC) for additional aid to address the humanitarian crisis in Myanmar.<sup>2215</sup> The funding will provide hospital care and health care services focusing on sexual and reproductive health, sexual and gender-based violence, psychosocial support for survivors and obstetric care.<sup>2216</sup> The funding will also provide access to water and sanitation services, and emergency shelter and non-food items for new asylum seekers.<sup>2217</sup> This funding will also support humanitarian efforts by Doctors Without Borders, United Nations High Commission for Refugees (UNHCR), ICRC, and International Organization for Migration in formal camps, informal settlements, and other hard-to-reach areas.<sup>2218</sup>

On 16 October 2017, Minister Bibeau announced that the Government of Canada would contribute over CAD1 million to the Canadian Foodgrains Bank to provide food assistance for 25,000 Rohingya refugees living in informal settlements in Bangladesh.<sup>2219</sup> This funding would focus on supporting the efforts of the Canadian Foodgrains Bank's members, Emergency Relief and Development Overseas, and World Renew to provide food assistance.<sup>2220</sup>

On 27 October 2017, the Government of Canada changed the definition of the age of dependents from individuals under 19 to those under 22.2221 This new age limit will enable more family members of refugees to qualify as dependents and reunite them with their families.<sup>2222</sup> The increased maximum

On 31 October 2017, Minister Bibeau launched the Myanmar Crisis Relief Fund to aid civil society organizations in delivering gender-sensitive humanitarian assistance to Rohingya refugees.<sup>2224</sup> The fund aims for the Government of Canada to match eligible donations contributed by individual Canadians to registered Canadian charities between 25 August 2017 and 28 November 2017.<sup>2225</sup> The funding will focus on meeting the needs of vulnerable women and girls, such as providing sexual and reproductive health services and psychosocial counselling for survivors of sexual and gender-based violence.<sup>2226</sup>

On 13 December 2017, Minister Bibeau announced that the Government of Canada would contribute CAD12.55 million to assist Rohingya refugees through the Myanmar Crisis Relief Fund. 2227 This contribution matches Canadian individuals' contributions to registered Canadian Charities between 25 August 2017 and 28 November 2017 to assist the Rohingva.<sup>2228</sup>

On 15 December 2017, Minister of Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Ahmed Hussen announced that the Government of Canada would contribute CAD10.4 million to assist vulnerable populations affected by the ongoing severe drought and food insecurity in Somalia.<sup>2229</sup> The funding will be allocated to the World Food Programme, UN Children's Fund, UN Development Programme, and American Refugee Committee. 2230 The funding will focus on providing food, waterand sanitation, treatment for acute malnutrition, medical support, shelter, and protection to affected populations.<sup>2231</sup>

On 20 December 2017, Minister Hussen announced that the Government of Canada would provide CAD15 million to assist refugees and drought-affected populations in Kenya.<sup>2232</sup> The funding will be allocated to the WFP and the UNHCR.<sup>2233</sup>

In 2017, Canada contributed USD81.9 million to the UNHCR, making it one of the top 10 donors to the UNHCR for that year.<sup>2234</sup>

On 20 February 2018, the Immigration and Refugee Board of Canada announced a change to its scheduling policy regarding refugee case hearings.<sup>2235</sup> This was intended to address the continued delays with hearing asylum claims, as asylum seekers wait an average of 16 months to have their case presented.<sup>2236</sup> The number of delayed cases has grown steadily throughout 2017.<sup>2237</sup> As of September 2017, the number of delayed cases has reached 34,462.<sup>2238</sup>

As of 27 February 2018, Syrian refugees are facing difficulties integrating into the Canadian job market.<sup>2239</sup> Despite having lived in Canada for months, if not more than a year, many Syrians are unable to find jobs.<sup>2240</sup> Almost 1,500 refugees landed in Halifax between November 2015 and July 2017, and half of them rely on income assistance due to the lack of available jobs, which is largely due to language barriers and a lack of skill recognition.<sup>2241</sup>

Canada has been active in addressing the needs of migrants both domestically and abroad. The Government of Canada has also collaborated with partners to facilitate successful resettlement of domestic refugees. While the Canadian government has shortcomings, it has been supporting its domestic refugees through income assistance and has actively addressed the backlog of refugee hearings/ Canada has also contributed internally to the needs of migrants through funds to provide food, sanitation, and other resources for the Rohingya refugees.

#### China: 0

China has partially complied with its commitment to address the distinct needs of refugees and migrants, in particular close to their region of origin and, when applicable, to enable them to return home safety.

On 19 September 2017, China delivered 500 tons of rice to Beirut for Syrian refugees residing in Lebanon. <sup>2242</sup> China has pledged 2,764 tons of food in total, the rest of which has yet to be delivered. <sup>2243</sup>

On 28 September 2017, China donated 150 tons of aid to the Rohingya refugees in Bangladesh.<sup>2244</sup> The donations are composed of items such as 2,000 relief tents and 3,000 blankets.<sup>2245</sup>

In September 2017, the Vice Minister of Commerce and Deputy China International Trade Representative signed an agreement with United Nations High Commission for Refugees (UNHCR) as part of the process to eventually fulfill China's pledge of USD1 billion towards refugees in Asia and Africa.<sup>2246</sup>

On 23 October 2017, 86,000 Syrian refugee students in Lebanon received educational supplies paid for by the Chinese government.<sup>2247</sup> Chinese Ambassador Wang Kejian, who personally delivered the supplies, has stated the aid is a representation of Chinese support for Syrian refugees.<sup>2248</sup>

On 4 November 2017, China arrested 10 refugees from North Korea, and returned them to North Korea by the end of the month.<sup>2249</sup> The Chinese government claims that the deportation was conducted in accordance with domestic and international laws.<sup>2250</sup> The number of North Korean

asylum seekers in China has risen sharply in the last year.<sup>2251</sup> From July to August 2017, China has arrested 41 North Koreans, a significant increase from the total 51 arrests between July 2016 to June 2017.<sup>2252</sup>

On 9 November 2017, China donated USD1 million to the World Food Programme (WFP) to provide aid and assistance to refugees and migrants in the Diffa Region in Niger.<sup>2253</sup>

On 27 November 2017, China donated an additional USD1 million to the WFP, towards refugees from Afghanistan and Iraq living in Iran.<sup>2254</sup> The funds have been allocated towards the purchase of food staples such as lentils, flour, rice, and sugar.<sup>2255</sup>

In 2017, China contributed USD11.1 million to the UNHCR.<sup>2256</sup>

On 13 February 2018, China's representative in Iran completed a refugee aid package of USD1 million.<sup>2257</sup> The aid was given under an agreement signed by China in August 2017 and was used primarily towards purchasing foodstuffs for Afghan and Iraqi refugees residing in Iran.<sup>2258</sup>

China has contributed to international actions to address the needs of refugees by donating aid to Syrian and Rohingya refugees and taking steps to fulfill its pledge of monetary funds towards refugees abroad, such as in Iran and Niger. However, China has largely failed to take domestic action to address the needs of migrants within its territory.

Thus, China receives a score of 0.

On 12 July 2017, the French government presented a new action plan for a balanced and controlled immigration policy.<sup>2259</sup> The plans include reducing the asylum procedure from 14 to 6 months, improving the integration of refugees, increasing reception facility capacities for asylum seekers, increasing genuine equal opportunities for all documented foreign nationals, installing a credible deportation policy, and improving focus on certain groups of asylum seekers. 2260

On 28 July 2017, President Emmanuel Macron publicly vowed to provide housing for all refugee and asylum seekers in France.<sup>2261</sup>

On 31 July 2017, the French government announced that it will provide water and sanitation to refugees and migrants in Calais and open two reception centres away from the port.<sup>2262</sup>

On 2 August 2017, Minister of the Interior Gérard Collomb pledged to welcome an additional 3,500 migrants to the country by the following year.<sup>2263</sup>

On 28 August 2017, France, Germany, Italy, and Spain agreed to help Chad and Niger with border control to stem the flow of migrants through Libya and across the Mediterranean.<sup>2264</sup> At the summit, Francealso called on the European Union to offer an extra EUR60 million to help African countries deal with asylum seekers who have returned from Europe and to prevent further migration flows.<sup>2265</sup>

On 28 August 2017, Minister Collomb announced that the government allowance to refugees voluntarily exiting France to return to their country of origin would be raised from EUR1,000 to EUR2,500 before 31 December 2017.2266

On 20 November 2017, Minister Collomb announced that France would receive refugees evacuated from Libya in December 2017.<sup>2267</sup> France plans to receive 10,000 refugees by 2019, with 3,000 people coming from a resettlement program in Niger and Chad. 2268

By the end of 2017, 43,000 asylum seekers had been granted refugee status in France that year. France received a record high of 100,412 asylum requests. 2270

In 2017, France contributed USD39.7 million to the United Nations High Commission for Refugees.<sup>2271</sup>

On 19 January 2018, President Macron and British Prime Minister Theresa May agreed on a the Sandhurst Treaty, anew border security deal through which the UK will pay EUR50 million for fencing, CCTV, and other detection technologies in Calais and channel ports, stoping migrants trying to reach British shores.<sup>2272</sup> The Sandhurst Treaty will speed up the time taken to process migration from Calais to the UK, reducing the wait time from six months to one month for adults, and 25 days for minors.<sup>2273</sup> The UK also agreed to accept 260 unaccompanied minors from France.<sup>2274</sup>

In February 2018, President Macron introduced proposals in legislation with the goals of speeding up the process for asylum requests and for expelling migrants who are unable to claim asylum.<sup>2275</sup> The new legislation also includes plans to introduce fines of EUR3,750 or a one year jail term for people who illegally cross borders within the EU.<sup>2276</sup> It also doubles the time asylum-seekers can be held in detention to 90 days, halves the amount of time asylum-seekers have to appeal their rejected refugee claims, hastens the deportation of asylum-seekers deemed to be economic migrants, and cuts the average waiting time on asylum applications from 11 months to six.<sup>2277</sup>

France has contributed to international projects that address refugee rights such as providing assistance to African countries to deal with their own migration flows. Yet although France has taken some steps to address the distinct needs of refugees and migrants in France, substantial systemic deficiencies remain.

Thus, France receives a score of 0.

#### Germany: +1

Germany has fully complied with its commitment to address the distinct needs of refugees and migrants, in particular close to their region of origin and, when applicable, to enable them to return home safety.

Since July 2017, the Federal Office of Migration and Refugees (BAMF) has been highly active in launching programs to properly integrate refugees into Germany's job market. <sup>2278</sup> However, structural challenges in the system continue to persist. <sup>2279</sup>

In July 2017, BAMF expanded their reach by providing additional translation services for migration, integration, and asylum procedures, showing adaptation to the diverse influx of people.<sup>2280</sup>

On 2 August 2017, BAMF began a project to improve regional cooperation for refugee integration programs in partnership with the Regional Directorate of Bavaria of the Federal Employment Agency together with the Bavarian Ministry of Labor, Social Affairs, Family and Integration.<sup>2281</sup>

In August 2017, Federal Ministry of the Economy and Technology outlined the ways in which refugees can integrate into the job market, specifically by filling the needs of skilled and unskilled workers in nursing homes through proper education and training.<sup>2282</sup>

In August 2017, BAMF took action to meet the psychological needs of refugees by subsidizing special trainings for integration teachers to deal with "traumatized refugees." <sup>2283</sup>

In September 2017, Germany announced it was contributing EUR60 million of humanitarian aid, through the UN, to Rohingya refugees in Bangladesh.<sup>2284</sup> For those still in Myanmar, the German government reserved EUR11.2 million to provide vital medical care, promote employment for internally displaced persons (IDPs), and help local communities with receiving IDPs.<sup>2285</sup>

In October 2017, hundreds of migrants participated in a social integration program, which emphasized greater integration in cultural and economic institutions. The program included a diverse

set of activities, including a day at the theatre. <sup>2286</sup> By December 2017, similar programs were implemented for older migrants and refugees to socialize with elderly Germans. <sup>2287</sup>

Furthermore, by October 2017, BAMF slowed down the processing of asylum claims. In the beginning months of 2017, 50,000 asylum cases were processed per month, compared to between 15,000 and 18,000 in recent months.<sup>2288</sup> Speculations included understaffing at BAMF and a system under strain and inefficiency.<sup>2289</sup>

In November 2017, the Kompetenzzentrum Fachkräftesicherung, one of Germany's primary skilled workers organizations, launched a detailed plan of action for the integration of refugees into the job market under the oversight of the Federal Ministry of the Economy and Technology.<sup>2290</sup>

Additionally, in November 2017, the German government announced its contribution of EUR2 million to the World Food Program's efforts to aid refugees and asylum seekers living in Tanzania and Rwanda, many of whom are from Burundi.<sup>2291</sup>

In 2017, Germany contributed USD476.9 million to the United Nations High Commission for Refugees (UNHCR), marking the UNHCR's second highest donation in 2017.<sup>2292</sup>

In January 2018, BAMF began easing legal processes for refugees.<sup>2293</sup> As part of the project, hotlines and online services for better and faster communication with courts were launched.<sup>2294</sup>

On 29 January 2018, the Federal Ministry of the Interior announced that it would resettle a small number of migrants from Italy and Greece, specifically those left outstanding from 2017.<sup>2295</sup>

In February 2018, BAMF and the UNHCR announced the intensification of their cooperation, especially in the quality of services provided for refugees.<sup>2296</sup> They announced their focus of 2018 as refugee resettlement, with the results of this joint goal yet to be seen.<sup>2297</sup>

Germany has launched highly ambitious programs in ensuring the economic and social integration of the millions of their migrants and refugees. It also continues to be a leading player in international efforts to help refugees.

Thus, Germany receives a score of +1.

#### India: 0

India has partially complied with its commitment to address the distinct needs of refugees and migrants, in particular close to their region of origin and, when applicable, to enable them to return home safety.

On 14 September 2017, the Indian government launched Operation Insaniyat to provide humanitarian assistance to refugees in Bangladesh.<sup>2298</sup> The relief material included sugar, pulses, rice, salt, and biscuits.<sup>2299</sup>

On 21 September 2017, the Indian government announced 116 new "high impact community development projects" in Afghanistan.<sup>2300</sup> One of the projects is a low cost housing program for ensuring the safe return of Afghan refugees.<sup>2301</sup>

On 22 November 2017, the Ministry of External Affairs announced the inclusion of persecuted minorities from Pakistan and Bangladesh in a self-financing scheme for educational programs.<sup>2302</sup>

This scheme will facilitate persecuted religious minority migrants in gaining access to higher education in India.<sup>2303</sup>

On 24 November 2017, India sent 3000 family relief packs with items such as rice, salt, sugar, and soap to the displaced people in the Rakhine State.<sup>2304</sup>

On 20 December 2017, Secretary of Foreign Affairs Dr S. Jaishankar signed a Memorandum of Understanding with Myanmar's Ministry of Social Welfare, Relief and Resettlement that initiated the Rakhine State Development program.<sup>2305</sup> Under the program, India will contribute USD25 million over a period of five years on development activities in the Rakhine state.<sup>2306</sup> The program attempts to facilitate the return of displaced persons by improving socio-economic conditions through various livelihood-generating initiatives.<sup>2307</sup> It also includes a project to build prefabricated housing that will provide an immediate living space to the returning refugees.<sup>2308</sup>

On 27 December 2017, the Indian paramilitary group Assam Rifles helped to repatriate 1600 refugees to Myanmar's Chin state.<sup>2309</sup> Fleeing violence between Myanmar's national forces and the Arakan Army militants, many displaced persons first sought shelter in India's Mizoram province in November 2017.<sup>2310</sup> Despite an improvement of the Chin state's security situation, most of the refugees have chosen to stay in India, though a small number of them were successfully repatriated by the paramilitary group.<sup>2311</sup> The refugees still present in the four villages in Mizoram's Lawngtlai district are being moved to a single relief camp in Hmawngbuchhuah village in order to ensure better access to food, essential commodities and relief materials.<sup>2312</sup>

In 2017, India did not contribute to the United Nations High Commission for Refugees.

Through the provision of humanitarian and development assistance, India has addressed its commitment to refugees in the international sphere. However, India has taken little action to meet the distinct needs of refugees and migrants domestically.

Thus, India receives a score of 0.

#### Indonesia: 0

Indonesia has partially complied with its commitment to address the distinct needs of refugees and migrants, in particular close to their region of origin and, when applicable, to enable them to return home safety.

On 13 September 2017, Indonesia sent 34 tons of aid to Rohingya refugees in Bangladesh.<sup>2313</sup> The aid included tents, rice, sugar and sanitation supplies, water tanks and blankets.<sup>2314</sup>

On 21 September 2017, the Embassy of Indonesia in Yangon and the National Disaster Management Agency provided humanitarian assistance to camps for internally displaced persons in Myanmar and conducted a training session which involved the installation of refugee tents and portable water tanks. <sup>2315</sup> The aid, which included sarongs, portable water tanks, medicine, and food, was delivered by Ambassador of Indonesia to Myanmar Ito Sumardi, who also promised further assistance for the reconstruction of damaged infrastructure. <sup>2316</sup>

On 14 November 2017, the Government of Indonesia signed the Association of Southeast Asian Nations' (ASEAN) Consensus on the Protection and Promotion of the Rights of Migrant Workers. <sup>2317</sup> In addition to highlighting the rights of migrant workers and their families, the Consensus outlines the obligations and commitments of ASEAN member states, including provisions that strengthen migrant workers' access to health services, social protection, and justice. <sup>2318</sup>

On 25 November 2017, Indonesia passed a law on the Protection of Indonesian Migrant Workers. 2319 The law installs measures to prevent the abuse of migrant workers, placing the responsibility for their protection on Indonesia's provincial governments.<sup>2320</sup> Regional bodies are now responsible for providing prospective migrants with pre-departure vocational training and information on the legal routes for seeking work abroad.<sup>2321</sup> Regional bodies must also ensure that migrant workers receive proper placements and submit reports on the performance of placement agencies.<sup>2322</sup> These measures are designed to ensure the protection of workers by holding private recruitment agencies accountable.<sup>2323</sup>

In 2017, Indonesia contributed USD60,000 to the UN High Commission for Refugees.<sup>2324</sup>

By strengthening the rights of migrant workers and providing humanitarian assistance to refugees abroad, Indonesia has fulfilled its international obligation with respect to the commitment. However, Indonesia has not adequately addressed the distinct needs of refugees within the country.

Thus, Indonesia receives a score of 0.

#### Italy: +1

Italy has fully complied with its commitment to address the distinct needs of refugees and migrants, in particular close to their region of origin and, when applicable, to enable them to return home safety.

On 12 July 2017, the Italian government advanced an 11-point plan that proposes new rules for nongovernmental organizations (NGOs) working with refugees in the Mediterranean Sea. 2325 The plan includes a ban on making phone calls or firing flares as they may signal to human traffickers to push boats full of migrants out to sea.<sup>2326</sup> NGO vessels are also required to allow police to travel with to

prevent human traffickers hiding amongst migrants.<sup>2327</sup> The boats will also no longer be able to transfer migrants from their boats to others, and are obliged to carry the migrants to the ports.<sup>2328</sup>

On 20 July 2017, Italy pledged a EUR9 million humanitarian aid package for Afghanistan, Somalia, South Sudan, and Palestine.<sup>2329</sup> Minister of Foreign Affairs Angelino Alfano announced that the aid will support a number of UN agencies and relief organizations, including the United Nations Relief and Works Agency for Palestinian Refugees in the Near East, UN High Commission for Refugees (UNHCR), and other Italian non-governmental organizations.<sup>2330</sup> The funding will also support programs enabling the repatriation of Somalian refugees from Kenya, supplying relief materials for refugees and displaced persons in Afghanistan, and assisting Uganda in hosting its South Sudanese refugees.<sup>2331</sup>

On 7 August 2017, Minister Alfano announced EUR2 million for Eritrean refugees in Ethiopia.<sup>2332</sup> The funding will provide assistance to host communities, including through the improvement of refugee reception and integration standards.<sup>2333</sup>

On 26 September 2017, Minister of the Interior Marco Minniti presented the first official plan for migrant integration initiatives.<sup>2334</sup> The plan's key objectives include teaching respect for women and the Italian language to new arrivals in Italy.<sup>2335</sup>

On 23 October 2017, Italy pledged EUR7 million in humanitarian aid to Rohingya refugees in Bangladesh and Myanmar. <sup>2336</sup> The funding will assure that food, healthcare, and protection is offered

to the refugees.<sup>2337</sup> It will be provided by UN agencies and the International Committee of the Red Cross.<sup>2338</sup>

On 22 December 2017, Minister Minniti promised to airlift 10,000 migrants from Libya by next year to counter human trafficking through the Mediterranean Sea.<sup>2339</sup>

In 2017, Italy contributed USD51.4 million to the UNHCR.<sup>2340</sup>

On 10 January 2018, during the Summit of the Southern European Union Countries, Italy and other European countries issued a statement urging the EU to share the responsibility of receiving refugees and helping those states that are at the forefront of the EU's external borders.<sup>2341</sup> They also expressed their determination to continue working with countries of origin and transit.<sup>2342</sup>

On 16 January 2018, the Italian coastguard and finance police, EU Operation Sophia, and ships run by humanitarian agencies rescued 1,400 migrants off the coast of Libya. <sup>2343</sup>

On 23 January 2018, Ambassador of Italy to Libya Giuseppe Perrone announced that Italy will send aid to refugees in southern Libya, like medicines and medical equipment, as part of a humanitarian assistance program.<sup>2344</sup>

In January 2018, Italy donated EUR250,000 to the UNHCR to support refugees in Zambia, including by providing basic needs such as food, clean water, sanitation, and blankets.<sup>2345</sup>

On 15 March 2018, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs donated EUR1 million the World Food Programme and UN Children's Fund to support Sahrawi refugees.<sup>2346</sup> The humanitarian aid will provide nutritional food, health, and education for the refugees.<sup>2347</sup>

Italy has fully complied with its commitment to address the distinct needs of migrants and refugees, in particular close to their regions of origin. It has taken international action by providing humanitarian aid for refugees in various countries like Afghanistan, Somalia, South Sudan and Bangladesh. It has also taken domestic action by rescuing migrants off their shores and bringing them to safety, as well as establishing integration methods for refugees.

Thus, Italy receives a score of +1.

#### Japan: 0

Japan has partially complied with its commitment to address the distinct needs of refugees and migrants, in particular close to their region of origin and, when applicable, to enable them to return home safety.

In August and September 2017, Syrian refugee students arrived in Japan to begin their studies as a part of the Japanese Initiative for the future of Syrian Refugees (JISR).<sup>2348</sup> The JISR was initiated by Government of Japan in partnership with United Nations High Commission for Refugees (UNHCR) in 2016 to provide Syrian refugee students with the opportunity to take courses for master's degree programs, with the intention of helping them to contribute to Syria's future reconstruction.<sup>2349</sup> The students will be learning Japanese and have received an orientation in Japanese society and culture.<sup>2350</sup>

On 4 October 2017, Japan announced USD3.5 million in emergency grant aid to Syrian refugees.<sup>2351</sup> Of the USD3.5 million, USD1.5 million was given to the UN Children's Fund (UNICEF) for vaccinations, sanitation, and other basic needs of Syrian women and children, and the other USD2 million was allocated to the UNHCR to meet the daily needs of urban refugees in Syria and provide health services.<sup>2352</sup>

On 17 October 2017, the Japanese government pledged USD8.6 million in aid towards the Rohingya refugee crisis in Myanmar.<sup>2353</sup>

Between 6 November 2017 and 1 December 2017, the Japanese government detained 91 asylum seekers working illegally in Japan.<sup>2354</sup>

In 2017, Japan contributed USD152.4 million to the UNHCR, making it one of the UNHCR's top donors for the year.<sup>2355</sup>

By the end of 2017, Japan accepted 20 of the 19,628 applications it received from asylum seekers in 2017.2356

On 12 January 2018, the Ministry of Justice initiated a new policy that aims to limit the number of work permits available to individuals who have applied for refugee status.<sup>2357</sup> This may increase barriers faced by refugees resettling into host communities, as work is a form of financial support and a way of social integration for migrants.<sup>2358</sup> The policy is part of an ongoing effort to discourage individuals from applying for refugee status in Japan.<sup>2359</sup> It will deny approximately 10,000 work permits to asylum seekers.<sup>2360</sup>

Japan has taken international action to meet the needs of Rohingya and Syrian refugees living abroad. However, Japan's stringent policies against asylum seekers, its limited support for domestic refugees, and new rules regarding asylum seekers' limited job access indicate that Japan does not take sufficient domestic actions in fulfilling its commitment to meeting the need of migrants.

Thus, Japan receives a score of 0.

#### Korea: 0

Korea has partially complied with its commitment to address the distinct needs of refugees and migrants, in particular close to their region of origin and, when applicable, to enable them to return home safety.

On 25 July 2017, 23 Myanmar nationals were resettled in Korea as part of United Nations High Commission for Refugees' (UNHCR's) resettlement program.<sup>2361</sup> Another 7 refugees from Myanmar arrived later in August.<sup>2362</sup> These refugees were given F-2 visas that allowed them to live and work in Korea, and they also received Korean language instruction and vocational training, in accordance with the 2013 Refugee Act.<sup>2363</sup>

On 22 August 2017, the Korean government pledged USD200,000 in humanitarian aid to Nepal in the wake of numerous floods and landslides that killed 131 and destroyed about 9,850 homes.<sup>2364</sup>

On 29 August 2017, the Ministry of Gender Equality and Family announced plans to build two shelters for female migrant victims of physical abuse.<sup>2365</sup>

On 5 September 2017, it was reported that Advocates for Public Interest Law and the International Organization for Migration had recently released a report detailing a two-year investigation into the conditions faced by migrant fishermen in South Korea.<sup>2366</sup> It found that migrant fishermen suffer poor living conditions, long work hours, unequal pay, and verbal and physical assault.<sup>2367</sup> Migrant fishermen are hired under the Seafarers Act, which does not include labour rights or a set minimum wage.<sup>2368</sup>

On 6 September 2017, Director-General of the International Labour Organization (ILO) Guy Ryder called for Korea's Employment Permit System to be reevaluated in order to prevent discrimination and inhuman working conditions.<sup>2369</sup> Under the current system, migrant workers do not have the right to seek new employment without the consent of their current employer, leaving them

vulnerable to abuse. <sup>2370</sup> He also stated that Korean labour law does not comply with ILO conventions, which stipulate equal treatment and freedom of association. <sup>2371</sup>

On 9 September 2017, the Korean government pledged USD200,000 in humanitarian aid to Bangladesh through the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies (IFRC).<sup>2372</sup>

On 20 September 2017, the Korean government pledged USD1.5 million to the International Organization for Migration (IOM) to provide humanitarian aid to the refugees that have fled Myanmar's Rakhine state.<sup>2373</sup>

As of 18 October 2017, Incheon has only nine lawyers within the Ministry of Justice to assist 61,254 foreign residents, including by helping migrants file complaints regarding wages, rental contracts, and immigration proceedings.<sup>2374</sup> As a result, the staff is unable to handle the number of requests received.<sup>2375</sup>

On 2 November 2017, the Korean government announced plans to investigate the situation of undocumented migrant children and address their distinct human rights concerns.<sup>2376</sup> At total of USD113,983 has been allocated to fund the project.<sup>2377</sup> After the investigation, the Ministry of Justice will be tasked with creating policies to ensure that the human rights of undocumented children are upheld.<sup>2378</sup>

As of 7 November 2017, Korea lacks a systematic support system for North Korean defectors, resulting in many North Korean refugees seeking asylum elsewhere.<sup>2379</sup> National Assembly Foreign Affairs and Unification Committee Member Lee Seok-hyun called on the Korean government to

expand its assistance framework and help North Korean defectors with finding sustainable jobs and accessing psychological support services during the integration process.<sup>2380</sup>

On 12 November 2017, the Executive Office of the Korean President called on China to release North Korean defectors to the Government of Korea during a meeting between Minister of Foreign Affairs Kang Kyung-wha and Chinese Minister of Foreign Affairs Wang Yi.<sup>2381</sup> This move followed a report received by the Korean Consulate in Shenyang, China that found that ten North Korean defectors were in danger of being deported by the Chinese police.<sup>2382</sup> If China agrees to cooperate, Presidential Press Secretary Yoon Young-chan stated that the decision to move to Korea would be based on the wishes of the defectors.<sup>2383</sup>

On 21 November 2017, the UN High Commissioner for Refugees Filippo Grandi stated that the Government of Korea's assistance to the UNHCR is likely to exceed USD30 million by the end of 2017.<sup>2384</sup>

On 7 December 2017, the Ministry of Employment and Labour announced that it will take steps to improve labour standards and workplace safety for migrant workers in Japan by ensuring them rights to overtime pay, sick leave, and paid holidays.<sup>2385</sup> This announcement was made after the National Human Rights Commission issued a report finding that migrant workers, on average, work 10.5 hours a day and 33 per cent of them live in temporary housing.<sup>2386</sup> A study conducted by the IOM Migration Research & Training Centre also found that 67.9 per cent of migrant workers who were injured on the job received no governmental compensation due to language barriers and efforts by employers to cover up accidents.<sup>2387</sup>

On 22 December 2017, an inter-ministerial committee in charge of managing the foreign labor force in Korea announced new policies to improve the working and living conditions of migrant workers.<sup>2388</sup> The committee, headed by Minister of the Office for Government Policy Coordination Hong Nam-gi, pledged to stop migrant workers from being placed with employers that offer vinyl or makeshift houses as residences.<sup>2389</sup> They also announced they would allow migrant workers to change

their places of employment if subjected to poor conditions, or if their wages had been unfairly reduced to pay for lodging.<sup>2390</sup>

On 26 December 2017, the Government of Korea announced an extra USD2.6 million in humanitarian aid to the Rohingya migrants in Bangladesh.<sup>2391</sup> These funds will be delivered through the UN Children's Fund (UNICEF), UNHCR, World Food Programme (WFP), and UN Population Fund.<sup>2392</sup>

In 2017, Korea contributed USD21.8 million to the UNHCR.<sup>2393</sup>

On 13 February 2018, the Korean Cabinet approved a revision to the North Korean Refugees Protection and Settlement Support Act that would cut the questioning period of North Korean defectors from 180 to 90 days.<sup>2394</sup> This was a response to critics who stated that the original questioning period which determines these migrants' motivations for defecting was unnecessarily long.<sup>2395</sup>

On 1 March 2018, the Government of Korea pledged 50,000 tons of Korean rice, valued at USD42.5 million to the WFP to distribute to displaced persons in Syria, Yemen, Kenya, Ethiopia, and Uganda.<sup>2396</sup>

Korea has taken international action by providing monetary assistance to organizations that work to address the distinct needs of migrants. However, while the Korean government does guarantee many rights to refugees, these same benefits are not extended to other migrants, such as humanitarian status holders. The high rejection rate of refugee status applications and the slowness of the review process show that asylum seekers are not subject to fair asylum procedures.

Thus, Korea receives a score of 0.

On 25 August 2017, United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees Filippo Grandi stated that Mexico needed to increase protection for asylum seekers, especially along its southern border to match the increase of applicants due to the violence against citizens in countries such as Honduras and El Salvador.<sup>2397</sup>

In 2017, Mexico contributed USD80,000 to the UN High Commission for Refugees (UNHCR).<sup>2398</sup>

As of 18 January 2018, Mexico has contributed USD900,000 to the World Food Programme (WFP) in 2017.<sup>2399</sup> The funds will go towards the World Food Programme to assist vulnerable Syrian refugees in Burundi, Jordan, Lebanon, South Sudan, Turkey, and the West Africa Bureau.<sup>2400</sup>

As of 23 January 2018, Mexican migration authorities have routinely deported asylum seekers from Honduras, El Salvador, and Guatemala without consideration for the risk to their security.<sup>2401</sup>

Mexico sustained existing international initiatives through its financial contributions to the UNHCR and WFP. However, it has failed to provide new concrete actions to address the unique needs of refugees and migrants domestically and has taken action that proves harmful to migrants.

Thus, Mexico receives a score of 0.

#### Russia: 0

Russia has partially complied with its commitment to address the distinct needs of refugees and migrants, in particular close to their region of origin and, when applicable, to enable them to return home safety.

On 17 July 2017, Russia delivered more than 20 tonnes of humanitarian aid to Yemen, including food, tents and medical equipment.<sup>2402</sup>

In July 2017, Russia granted refugee status to two individuals from Syria, although there are reportedly 7,000 Syrians in Russia who have been assisted by the United Nations High Commission for Refugees (UNHCR).<sup>2403</sup>

Between July 2017 and December 2017, the number of individuals granted asylum in Russia has dropped significantly.<sup>2404</sup> Police forces are regularly arresting individuals applying for asylum status

and the Directorate of Migration Affairs brings administrative charges and fines against asylum seekers, violating Article 31 of the UN Convention Relating to the Status of Refugees.<sup>2405</sup>

On 10 January 2018, the Russian Foreign Ministry announced that Russia allocated USD10 million in funding to the UN Relief and Works Agency for Palestinian Refugees in the Near East for its work in 2017-2021.<sup>2406</sup>

In 2017, Russia contributed USD2 million to the UNHCR.<sup>2407</sup>

Russia has taken minimal steps to ensure the protection of migrants and refugees internationally, by donating money to the UNHCR. However, it has severely undermined these efforts through its unfair treatment of asylum seekers within its own territory.

Thus, Russia receives a score of 0.

#### Saudi Arabia: 0

Saudi Arabia has partially complied with its commitment to address the distinct needs of refugees and migrants, in particular close to their region of origin and, when applicable, to enable them to return home safety.

By 24 August 2017, the Saudi Arabian government ordered illegal migrants to register their intention to return to their country of origin, regardless of the domestic conditions of each individual's country of origin.<sup>2408</sup> If they fail to register, they could face detention, fines, and deportation.<sup>2409</sup>

In September 2017, the Saudi Arabian government pledged USD15 million in aid for Rohingya Muslim refugees in Myanmar.<sup>2410</sup>

In November 2017 at the United Nations General Assembly, the Government of Saudi Arabia pledged USD37 million to the UN Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees in the Near East

(UNRWA) to assist Palestinian refugees in 2018.<sup>2411</sup>As of 6 November 2017, Saudi Arabia pledged over USD51 million to the UNRWA to support programs in health and education in 2017.<sup>2412</sup>

By 29 November 2017, more than 1300 Ethiopians were expelled from Saudi Arabia in "recent days." Many expelled Ethiopians were unable to claim asylum and be entitled to international protection due to the fact that Saudi Arabia is not party to the 1951 Refugee Convention. 2414

In 2017, Saudi Arabia contributed USD18 million to the UN High Commission for Refugees (UNHCR).<sup>2415</sup>

On 6 January 2018, Saudi Arabia and the UAE agreed to join Malaysia in a joint humanitarian project to assist Rohingya refugees in Cox's Bazaar in Bangladesh.<sup>2416</sup> Saudi Arabia agreed to provide medical supplies and other materials for Malaysia's field hospital to assist refugees.<sup>2417</sup>

On 22 January 2018, the Saudi Arabian government pledged USD1.5 billion in humanitarian aid for Yemen, although the funds have not yet been formally allocated.<sup>2418</sup>

On 29 January 2018, Saudi Arabia and the UN High Commissioner for Refugees signed an agreement to assist Syrian refugees in Lebanon.<sup>2419</sup> The agreement includes a USD3.5 million contribution from Saudi Arabia for a housing rehabilitation project for refugees.<sup>2420</sup>

Saudi Arabia has taken some steps to address the distinct needs of refugees and migrants by providing monetary aid to international organizations that assist refugees abroad but has not taken any steps to support refugees domestically.

Thus, Saudi Arabia receives a score of 0.

#### South Africa: 0

South Africa has partially complied with its commitment to address the distinct needs of refugees and migrants, in particular close to their region of origin and, when applicable, to enable them to return home safety.

On 23 August 2017, more than 473 migrant applications were delayed by the South African government.<sup>2421</sup> The Department of Home Affairs is legally required to process overdue applications within a reasonable timeframe; however, some have been delayed for over four years.<sup>2422</sup>

As of September 2017, the low number of Refugee Reception Offices (RROs) throughout the country meant asylum seekers were facing difficulties in maintaining the validity of their documentation, as they were required to travel long distances to RROs every three to six months.<sup>2423</sup> RROs are critical to carrying out the services entitled to asylum seekers by the Refugee Act.<sup>2424</sup>

On 3 October 2017, Minister of Home Affairs Hlengiwe Mkhize spoke to the Executive Committee of the United Nations High Commission for Refugees (UNHCR).<sup>2425</sup> The Minister reaffirmed the South African government's commitment to keeping their ports of entry open to incoming migrants and providing access to education and healthcare.<sup>2426</sup> She also confirmed that the South African government has upgraded the technology in its refugee centres to increase efficiency in processing asylum applications.<sup>2427</sup>

As of 17 October 2017, a growing number of asylum seekers were being arrested and deported without due process as they attempted to renew their Section 22 permits.<sup>2428</sup> There had been many instances where asylum seekers were only verbally told that their application had been denied and did

not receive any kind of written record.<sup>2429</sup> Additionally, in some cases, asylum seekers were told their applications had been denied despite an official decision never being made.<sup>2430</sup>

On 18 October 2017, the South African government announced the development of an action plan to address the unique challenges faced by unaccompanied migrant children. <sup>2431</sup> There has been a lack of funding in this area, many front-line officials are incapable of adequately providing for unaccompanied children, and there are no accurate statistics on this specific demographic. <sup>2432</sup> Migrant children in South Africa generally lack access to basic services, which is a violation of human rights protected by the South African Constitution. <sup>2433</sup>

On 15 November 2017, the Department of Home Affairs introduced a new travel document for refugees, with updated technology and security standards, in accordance with the UNHCR and International Civil Aviation Authority guidelines.<sup>2434</sup> The enhanced security decreases the risk of identity fraud and increases trust in the refugee who uses them, ensuring safe travel for refugees, as the risk of exploitation, abuse, and violence decreases.<sup>2435</sup>

On 13 December 2017, a report indicated that dozens of migrant children were being illegally detained alongside adults at the Lindela Repatriation Centre.<sup>2436</sup> In addition, the clinic at the centre denied life-saving care to migrants and lacks Tuberculosis and Human Immunodeficiency Virus testing equipment.<sup>2437</sup> Beatings and suspicious deaths have also been reported at the Krugersdorp centre.<sup>2438</sup>

On 18 December 2017, the Government of South Africa passed the Refugees Amendment Act.<sup>2439</sup> The amendment includes policies dictating that refugees may lose their status through voluntary actions, such as re-availing themselves to their country of origin, or if the circumstances for their refugee status no longer exist.<sup>2440</sup>

On 19 December 2017, it was reported that migrant business owners are often subjected to harassment and extortion, receive minimal protection from the police, and oftentimes must bribe officials.<sup>2441</sup> Furthermore, South Africa's migration policy has become more exclusionary as evident by the 90 per cent rejection rate among asylum and refugee applications.<sup>2442</sup>

In 2017, the Departments of Health and of Sports and Recreation assisted the International Organization for Migration in providing healthcare to migrants and had supported migrant youth in sports participation.<sup>2443</sup>

Additionally, in 2017, the Government of South Africa contributed USD147,382 to the UNHCR.<sup>2444</sup>

As of 31 January 2018, the portable toilets at the Cape Town Refugee Reception Office was removed and migrants have resorted to relieving themselves on the grounds outside the building.<sup>2445</sup>

On 10 February 2018, Home Affairs Director of Asylum Seeker Management Mandla Madumisa reported that there is currently a backlog of 140,000 asylum status appeal cases during a hearing conducted by the South African Human Rights Commission.<sup>2446</sup> Furthermore, the majority of asylum seekers need to bribe officials with ZAR2,500 in order to gain refugee status.<sup>2447</sup>

As of 7 March 2018, over 1,000 asylum seekers are fearing deportation because the Department of Home Affairs lacks the interpreters needed to provide assistance with applications for refugee

status.<sup>2448</sup> Without a refugee application underway, asylum seekers lack the documentation that prevents the police from deporting them.<sup>2449</sup> Under normal circumstances, asylum seekers could access a call centre and request a translator to accompany them to the Department of Home Affairs, but the call centres are understaffed.<sup>2450</sup>

South Africa has contributed to international actions to address the distinct needs of refugees and migrants by contributing financial support to organizations such as the UNHCR. Domestically, South Africa has worked to improve their refugee determination process. However, it is difficult for migrants to access the services they are entitled to and efforts have not been made to address these problems.

Thus, South Africa receives a score of 0.

## Turkey: +1

Turkey has fully complied with its commitment to address the distinct needs of refugees and migrants, in particular close to their region of origin and, when applicable, to enable them to return home safety.

On 13 July 2017, the United Kingdom's Independent Chief Inspector of Borders and Immigration David Bolt published a report based on an inspection of entry clearance operations in Istanbul carried out by the Turkish government between November 2016 and March 2017.<sup>2451</sup> He found that Istanbul's handling of family reunification applications had improved.<sup>2452</sup> Nonetheless, he mentioned work still needs to be done in granting access to interpreters and the commissioning and funding of DNA tests.<sup>2453</sup>

In August 2017, the Ministry of Family and Social Affairs announced that it would oversee the return of 100,000 Syrians to Syria by the end of 2017, in cooperation with the United Nations High Commission for Refugees (UNHCR).<sup>2454</sup> This is in addition to the 70,000 individuals that have

already returned.<sup>2455</sup> The Ministry announced that psychological support would be provided to women and children returnees.<sup>2456</sup> Furthermore, the Turkish Disaster Management Agency intends to help rebuild towns in northern Syria to help facilitate refugee return.<sup>2457</sup>

On 2 September 2017, the Cooperation and Coordination Agency donated its first shipment of 1,000 tonnes of foodstuffs and medicine to the conflict zone of the Rakhine state in Myanmar, making it the first foreign organization to do so.<sup>2458</sup>

In November 2017, Turkey received EUR2.9 billion from the EU from its 18 March 2016 EUR3 billion pledge to provide a wide range of services, including healthcare, border control, education and a limited universal income for Syrian refugees.<sup>2459</sup>

In November 2017, the Ministry of National Education and UNICEF published two guidebooks to enhance the quality of special education services offered to Syrian refugees in public schools and temporary education centres.<sup>2460</sup>

Additionally, in November 2017, the Ministry of Family and Social Policies and UNICEF collaborated to develop a Rolling Work Plan for 2018-2019 to expand social cohesion programmes to integrate Turkish language courses and child protection services for refugee children.<sup>2461</sup>

On 22 November 2017, Deputy Prime Minister Recep Akdag announced that Turkey would build 5,000 prefabricated homes for Rohingya refugees in Bangladesh in addition to its initial promise of 20,000.<sup>2462</sup> The Disaster and Emergency Management Authority (AFAD), Turkish Red Crescent, and

TIKA also promised to build two field hospitals and ten medical centers in Cox's Bazaar to support Rohingya refugees.<sup>2463</sup>

On 29 November 2017, Minister of Family and Social Policies Fatma Kaya stressed that a significant portion of the EUR3.3 billion allocated by the EU to Turkey for refugees must go toward the education of Syrian refugee children.<sup>2464</sup> UNICEF found a 22 per cent increase of the Syrian refugee children receiving cash transfers from the Turkish state to attend school from September 2017 to November 2017.<sup>2465</sup> As a result, regular school enrolment has increased in this period.<sup>2466</sup>

On 19 December 2017, Prime Minister Binali Yıldırım vowed that Turkey would continue to support Bangladesh with Rohingya refugees during an official visit to the country. Since mid-September, TIKA distributed 2.5 tonnes of ingredients every day, often rice, lentils, and potatoes to Rohingya refugees in southern Bangladesh. And also distributed 10,000 blankets, provided essential medical care, and built a playground for Rohingya children in refugee camps. AFAD and Religious Affairs Directorate also provided aid and medical care for Rohingya refugees.

In 2017, Turkey contributed USD300,000 to the UNHCR.<sup>2471</sup>

On 7 February 2018, Minister Kaya announced her continued commitment to meeting the needs of refugees by expanding the psychological support services that had already been given to 300,000

Syrian refugees.<sup>2472</sup> She reiterated her focus on women and children, with a commitment to continue placing vulnerable children in foster care, and abused women into shelters.<sup>2473</sup>

On 15 February 2018, Minister Kaya welcomed UN High Commissioner for Refugees Filippo Grandi and maintained her call for cooperation in directing funds properly towards refugee care.<sup>2474</sup> The Minister again specifically took into consideration the needs of children, such as education, by calling for continued cooperation with UNICEF in implementing the Mandatory Education Program.<sup>2475</sup>

On 23 February 2018, Head of the AFAD Mehmet Gulluoglu announced that Turkey distributed more than USD10 million in aid to support Rohingya refugees in Bangladesh since August 2017.<sup>2476</sup>

Given the large influx of refugees within Turkey, efforts have been concentrated on domestic actions. Turkey has taken some steps towards addressing the needs of migrants within their territory by financially contributing to refugee assistance programs, especially considering the needs of women and children, and collaborating with international organizations. Turkey has also taken various steps to meet the distinct needs for Rohingya refugees in Bangladesh, meeting the international component of the commitment, by providing medical equipment, foodstuffs and building infrastructure for refugees.

Thus, Turkey receives a score of +1.

## **United Kingdom: 0**

The United Kingdom has partially complied with its commitment to address the distinct needs of refugees and migrants, in particular close to their region of origin and, when applicable, to enable them to return home safety.

On 13 July 2017, a report published by Independent Chief Inspector of Borders and Immigration David Bolt reaffirmed the Home Office's default position of refusing family reunification requests

for refugees coming from Turkey rather than deferring a decision until more evidence can be produced.<sup>2477</sup>

On 19 July 2017, Home Secretary Amber Rudd announced a GBP1 million fund to help communities support refugees.<sup>2478</sup> The money would be used to fund training and support for all the groups that decided to join the program.<sup>2479</sup>

On 25 August 2017, 8,500 Syrian refugees arrived in the UK as part of the Vulnerable Persons Resettlement Scheme.<sup>2480</sup> This meant that over one third of the refugees that the UK government promised to resettle before 2020 were already in the UK.<sup>2481</sup>

In 2017 the United Kingdom was the ninth highest donor to the United Nations High Commission for Refugees (UNCHR) with a total amount of USD52.3 million donated.<sup>2482</sup>

On 6 October 2017, the International Organization for Migration (IOM) announced the Department for International Development had donated 4,000 shelter kits to Rohingya refugees fleeing into Bangladesh.<sup>2483</sup> Each shelter kit contained two plastic sheets, two ropes, two blankets and one sleeping mat per family.<sup>2484</sup>

On 9 November 2017, it was announced that councils across England will receive GBP18 million in extra funding from the UK government in order to alleviate local services' over-extension caused by recent migration influxes.<sup>2485</sup>

On 15 November 2017, UN High Commissioner for Human Rights Zeid Ra'ad al-Hussein accused the UK, among other countries, for the hardships that Libyan refugees endure.<sup>2486</sup> The comments

come in the context of the UK supporting the Libyan coastguard in intercepting refugee boats so they do not land in Italy.<sup>2487</sup> The High Commissioner was particularly vocal in regards to the beatings, shootings, and fatal sinking of migrants and refugees that allegedly occur.<sup>2488</sup>

On 17 November 2017, the Department for International Development co-funded a program that provides solar energy to remote health posts where Rohingya refugees reside.<sup>2489</sup> The program allows for 24-hour healthcare services, which would have been otherwise restricted at night time.<sup>2490</sup>

On 12 December 2017, Deputy Permanent Representative to the UN Jonathan Allen stated in a speech that the UK provided USD79 million to the UN's Humanitarian Response Plan in order to provide life-saving assistance and protection to refugees fleeing towards Bangladesh.<sup>2491</sup> He also called upon Myanmar to engage with the UN Secretary General openly and meaningfully in order to ensure that the return of refugees will eventually be possible.<sup>2492</sup>

On 14 December 2017, the UK government pledged a GBP52 million humanitarian package for South Sudan in the context of the start of peace negotiations.<sup>2493</sup> The aid will also extend to neighbouring Sudan, Uganda, and Ethiopia, which have also been affected by South Sudanese refugee influxes.<sup>2494</sup> The package will provide enough medicine, shelter, food, and sanitation to help 50,000 South Sudanese migrants for the next five years.<sup>2495</sup> Additionally, food assistance will be offered to 950,000 refugees living in Uganda.<sup>2496</sup> Essential healthcare will also be provided to 450,000 refugees sheltered in Ethiopia.<sup>2497</sup> As many as 500,000 individuals in South Sudan will be aided

through emergency food, medicine, shelter, health and sanitation, seeds, tools, and fishing kits, which will enable the South Sudanese to feed their families.<sup>2498</sup>

On 18 December 2017, International Development Secretary Penny Mordaunt unveiled an aid package meant to address forced displacement.<sup>2499</sup> She reiterated the above-mentioned figures for South Sudan, to which she added that 460,000 refugees in Tanzania will be helped to find work so that they can remain where they are without being forced to migrate elsewhere to find job opportunities.<sup>2500</sup> The Secretary also announced a GBP5 million aid package to Libya, which would offer humanitarian aid to migrants and refugees, including some of those in detention.<sup>2501</sup> She said the UK was collaborating with Ethiopia to create 100,000 new jobs for Ethiopians and refugees through a Jobs Compact program.<sup>2502</sup> the UK has helped issue 70,000 work permits for Syrian refugees in Jordan.<sup>2503</sup> The UK has also helped return 2,200 people from Libya and Niger. Secetary Mordaunt also announced the establishment of a fund called Education Cannot Wait, which offers education opportunities to 4.5 million children in Chad, Ethiopia, and Syria.<sup>2504</sup>

In 2017, the UK contributed USD136.2 million to the UNHCR.<sup>2505</sup>

On 16 January 2018, extra funding valuing a total of GBP29 million was given to councils from the UK government in order to support them in aiding unaccompanied asylum-seeking children.<sup>2506</sup>

On 19 January 2018, Prime Minister Theresa May signed the Sandhurst Treaty with French President Emmanuel Macron for Calais to prevent migrants from crossing to the UK through France.<sup>2507</sup> As a result of this deal, the UK will pay EUR50 million for fencing, CCTV, and other detection technologies in Calais and channel ports, essentially stopping migrants trying to reach British shores.<sup>2508</sup> The Sandhurst Treaty will speed up the time taken to process migration from Calais to the

UK, reducing the wait time from six months to one month for adults, and 25 days for minors.<sup>2509</sup> The UK also agreed to accept 260 unaccompanied minors from France.<sup>2510</sup>

On 26 February 2018, the IOM announced the UK had resettled 10,538 refugees as part of the Vulnerable Persons Resettlement Scheme.<sup>2511</sup> It is a system meant to resettle Middle Eastern and Northern African minors and their families whose lives are at risk.<sup>2512</sup>

The United Kingdom has taken efforts to meet the domestic and international components of this commitment. Domestically, it has accepted refugees and has enhanced the integration of refugees and migrants. It has also taken a substantial role in international efforts to address the needs of migrants by providing aid packages to refugees in countries such as South Sudan and Tanzania. However, the United Kingdom has also undermined its efforts to addressing the needs of refugees by supporting the Libyan coast guard and signing an agreement with France to stop migrants from reaching British shores.

Thus, the United Kingdom receives a score of 0.

## **United States: 0**

The United States has partially complied with its commitment to address the distinct needs of refugees and migrants, in particular close to their region of origin and, when applicable, to enable them to return home safety.

On 13 July 2017, the US Agency for International Development (USAID) announced USD119 million in funding to assist Iraqis displaced by ISIS.<sup>2513</sup> The aid includes medical care and nutritional assistance.<sup>2514</sup>

On 20 September 2017, USAID announced nearly USD264 million in funding to assist internally displaced persons (IDPs) in Iraq. <sup>2515</sup> The funding will help provide emergency shelter, health care, safe drinking water, and food. <sup>2516</sup>

On 24 September 2017, President Donald Trump issued travel restrictions for nationals of Chad, Yemen, Libya, Iran, North Korea, Somalia, Syria, and Venezuela. The travel restrictions took full effect on 4 December 2017. 2518

As of 30 September 2017, the US government announced that funding figures for Syria for the fiscal years of 2012-2017 reached a total of USD7.5 million.<sup>2519</sup> The funding supported organizations including the United Nations High Commission for Refugees (UNHCR), International Organization for Migration (IOM), UN Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees in the Near East, UN Children's Fund (UNICEF), and the World Health Organization, among various others, in assisting IDPs in Syria.<sup>2520</sup> The funding went to activities such as humanitarian coordination and information management, relief commodities, shelter and settlements, meeting health concerns and providing nutritious meals, and offering protection and education for children.<sup>2521</sup>

On 24 October 2017, the 120-day suspension of the refugee admissions program put into place by President Trump expired.<sup>2522</sup> The March 2017 Executive Order,directed the Secretary of State and Secretary of Homeland Security to suspend the refugee admissions program for 120 days, though waivers were still granted on a case-by-case basis.<sup>2523</sup> The United States refugee admissions program thus resumed at this time, although President Trump called for a 90-day review for the program in regards to 11 "high risk" countries of origin.<sup>2524</sup>

On 24 October 2017, President Trump issued an Executive Order calling for a 90-day review of security procedures for 11 countries, including Egypt, Iran, Iraq, Mali, South Sudan, and Syria. 2525

As of 31 December 2017, the US continued its funding of the Refugee and Entrant Assistant account for the fiscal year of 2017 at USD2.141 billion to address migrant needs in integrating into US society.<sup>2526</sup>

For the fiscal year of 2017, the US provided over USD1 billion in humanitarian funding for the Horn of Africa. <sup>2527</sup> The US has collaborated with the UNHCR, UNICEF, IOM, the World Food Programme (WFP) and numerous other non-governmental organizations. <sup>2528</sup> The funding has supported activities such as providing nutrition for refugees, preventing gender-based violence for refugee women in camps, providing basic education for refugees, and providing psychosocial assistance for refugees, among others. <sup>2529</sup>

Additionally, in 2017, the US contributed USD1.45 billion to the UNHCR, making it the largest donor in that year.<sup>2530</sup> During the same period, the US has reduced the number of refugee applicants it will accept and the number of offices that handle refugees.<sup>2531</sup>

On 8 January 2018, President Trump ended the temporary protected status of Salvadorans living in the US, forcing them to leave the country or be deported by September 2019.<sup>2532</sup> The temporary protection status is a humanitarian relief program aimed at providing relief for people fleeing their

country due to natural disasters or conflict.<sup>2533</sup> Salvadorians are the fourth nationality to lose temporary protection status in the US since January 2017.<sup>2534</sup>

On 31 January 2018, the Department of Homeland Security announced enhanced security procedures for refugees seeking resettlement in the US.<sup>2535</sup> These procedures included additional screening procedures for 11 countries and periodic reviews of the high-risk refugee countries of origin list.

As of 6 March 2018, the US government committed USD648.6 million in humanitarian funding for the Lake Chad Basin Response for the fiscal year of 2017-2018.<sup>2536</sup> The funding supports agencies like the UNHCR, IOM, UNICEF, WFP, among others.<sup>2537</sup> The funding supports initiatives for displaced persons, including providing protection and offering multi-sector assistance for IDPs, and offering education, health, and nutrition assistance for IDPs and host communities in Nigeria, Chad, Niger, and Cameroon.<sup>2538</sup>

On 6 March 2018, the US government announced that an additional USD184 million in humanitarian assistance would be provided in response to the South Sudan crisis. Of the USD184 million, USD145 million was committed for interventions in South Sudan and nearly USD39 million was committed for projects that assist South Sudanese refugees in neighbouring countries. The funding supports agencies including the UNHCR, International Committee of the Red Cross, UNICEF, WFP, and IOM. The funding has supported preventing gender-based violence, safe

drinking water and nutrition, providing basic education, and providing psychosocial assistance for IDPs among others.<sup>2541</sup>

On 8 March 2018, the Migrant and Refugee Human Rights Protection Project, which was sponsored by USAID, ended.<sup>2542</sup> The US provided a total of USD673,301 to the Macedonian Young Lawyers Association over a period of two years in order to provide legal assistance, monitoring and capacity building on issues related to asylum seekers, migrants, and refugees.<sup>2543</sup>

The US has implemented some measures which addresses the needs of migrants internationally and domestically based on its funding of certain programs. However, travel restrictions and enhanced security policies enacted create an unfair set of procedures for domestic refugee determination processes.

Thus, the United States receives a score of 0.

## **European Union: +1**

The European Union has fully complied with its commitment to address the distinct needs of refugees and migrants, in particular close to their region of origin and, when applicable, to enable them to return home safety.

On 6 September 2017, the European Commission called on all member states to keep up the good work made in the process of managing irregular migration.<sup>2544</sup> At the same time, it also announced that 27,695 persons had been relocated to Turkey through the EU-Turkey Statement, which has both curtailed irregular migration and facilitated the resettlement of 10,000 Syrians in the EU.<sup>2545</sup> Particularly, the EU-Turkey refugee deal has helped reduce the number of arrivals to just 75 arrivals per day, equating to an overall decrease of 97 per cent since the Statement first began operating.<sup>2546</sup> The European Commission also increased monetary support for the Facility for Refugees in Turkey. Of the EUR3 billion to be allocated, contracts to deliver financial support were signed for a total of EUR1.66 billion and disbursements increased to EUR838 million.<sup>2547</sup> As a result, the number of refugees helped by the Emergency Social Safety Net, a humanitarian program funded by the EU,

rose from 600,000 to 860,000 and is expected to reach 1.3 million by the end of 2017.<sup>2548</sup> The European Commission stated it had collaborated with partners in Africa to stabilize death rates at sea and reduce the number of people crossing the Mediterranean Sea to Europe.<sup>2549</sup>

On 20 July 2017, the Initiative for the Protection and Reintegration of Migrants, in collaboration with the EU and International Organization for Migration (IOM) was launched in Nigeria. The EU Trust Fund supports the initiative, which provides Nigerian migrants reintegration assistance to start businesses, provide educational opportunities, or cover medical and accommodation costs upon repatriation. The Protection and Reintegration and Reintegration assistance to start businesses, provide educational opportunities, or cover medical and accommodation costs upon repatriation.

On 6 September 2017, High Representative of the Commission Federica Mogherini indicated that the EU helped assist over 11,000 migrants in their voluntary returns to Libya and Niger alongside the IOM since 2016.<sup>2552</sup> Similarly, under the Partnership Framework, the Sahel region was aided by the EU in areas of security and development.<sup>2553</sup> A grand total of 169 contracts, worth over EUR1.2 billion, were signed under the EU Trust Fund for Africa, which had expanded to cover Guinea Bissau, Ghana, and Cote d'Ivoire as well.<sup>2554</sup> The EU also helps the G5 Sahel force with financial packages worth EUR 50 million.<sup>2555</sup> The EU also worked alongside Italy and Libya to build border and migration management capacities in Libya. Their cost was EUR46.3 million.<sup>2556</sup> Through this effort, protection of migrants and refugees was improved, willful returns increased, and legal avenues for persons in need of protection were opened throughout 2017.<sup>2557</sup>

On 27 September 2017, President Jean-Claude Juncker presented a set of initiatives to enforce the EU migration and asylum policy in his State of the Union Address.<sup>2558</sup> The President presented a new resettlement scheme for at least 50,000 refugees, pilot projects for legal migration that would be financially supported by the European Commission, and new measures to create a more effective EU return policy.<sup>2559</sup> The EU had helped alleviate the burden on Italy and Greece by relocating 29,000 people.<sup>2560</sup> The new resettlement scheme indicated that at least 50,000 vulnerable persons should be brought in the EU over the next 2 years.<sup>2561</sup> This scheme will be effective until October 2019 and will be undertaken in collaboration with member states, which are bound to receive EUR500 million in order to pursue proper resettlement.<sup>2562</sup>

On 17 October 2017, the European Commission announced that it had reached one million refugees living in Turkey through its Emergency Social Safety Net program, which initially began in September 2016.<sup>2563</sup>

On 23 October 2017, the European Union co-hosted a conference in Geneva alongside the IOM, the United Nations High Commission for Refugees (UNHCR), the UN Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs, and Kuwait. A total of 35 humanitarian aid pledges were made, collectively worth USD344 million.<sup>2564</sup> The pledges directed humanitarian aid to Rohingya refugees and host communities in Bangladesh.<sup>2565</sup>

On 15 November 2017, High Representative Mogherini pledged to strengthen the European Agenda on Migration. At the same time, she announced its already existing successes, which include providing EUR3 billion to refugees in Turkey by the end of 2017, facilitating access to monthly electronic cash transfers to 1 million Syrian refugees, investing almost EUR2 billion in the EU Trust Fund for Africa to support economic development and help manage migration crises, as well as

cooperating with the UNHCR, UN Children's Fund, and the IOM to improve living conditions of migrants in Libya through medical assistance.<sup>2567</sup> In addition, the EU Trust Fund for Africa also worked in tandem with the Nigerian government in search-and-rescue missions in deserts, which resulted in 1,100 migrants being brought to safety.<sup>2568</sup> Almost 15,000 migrants, 10,000 of them from Libya, have been helped to voluntarily return to their countries of origin.<sup>2569</sup> The EU has also worked with member to extract pledges for the new resettlement scheme. As a result, 34,400 pledges have been made by 16 EU member since September 2017, but could exceed 50,000 by October 2019.<sup>2570</sup>

On 20 December 2017, the European Commission drafted the European Partnership for Integration alongside its social and economic partners in order to facilitate the integration of refugees into the European labour market.<sup>2571</sup> The plan emphasis youth employment and intends to engage private and public actors, EU institutions, local authorities, and civil society organizations.<sup>2572</sup> The key principles of the plan include providing support at the earliest time possible, making sure integration actually benefits refugees in a meaningful way, and ensuring a multi-stakeholder approach.<sup>2573</sup> Among the commitments expressed, the main points were the sharing of best practices between social and economic parties, organization of mentoring programmes to ease access into the workplace, ensuring and making identification, assessment, and documentation of skills to be done.<sup>2574</sup>

In 2017, the EU contributed USD436 million to the UNHCR, making it the third largest donor in that year.<sup>2575</sup>

On 15 January 2018, the EU adopted a EUR5 million programme that will provide humanitarian support to Rohingya refugees in Bangladesh.<sup>2576</sup> The programme will keep adding to previous identification and registration efforts undertaken on behalf of the Bangladeshi government. Its main

goal is to facilitate the creation of required conditions for the voluntary, safe, and dignified return of the Rohingva who have fled Myanmar.<sup>2577</sup>

On 30 January 2018, the European Commission announced EUR37.5 million in humanitarian aid for Afghanistan, Pakistan, and Iran.<sup>2578</sup> The sum is broken down as follows: EUR27 million will be distributed to provide emergency trauma care, food, water, sanitation, shelter, and protection for those affected by conflict in Afghanistan; EUR5.5 million will be distributed to vulnerable Afghans in Pakistan to quell issues such as food security and malnutrition; a further EUR5 million will be distributed to Afghan refugees in Iran in order to provide food assistance, shelter, health, protection, and education.<sup>2579</sup>

On 16 February 2018, the EU Agency for Fundamental Rights organized a peer learning activity event which stressed the importance of migrant integration through inclusive education, gender equality lessons, and adequate training for teachers.<sup>2580</sup>

On 26 February 2018, the European Commission adopted three new programmes worth more than EUR150 million to protect migrants and provide them with adequate reintegration options in Libya, Ethiopia, and along the Central Mediterranean Route.<sup>2581</sup> Through these programmes, the EU was delivering on commitments previously made as part of a joint UN, African Union (AU), and EU Task Force established on 29 November 2017 to save and protect lives of migrants and refugees along the routes and within Libya, while also speeding up the voluntary returns to countries of origin, as well as the resettlement of those who required international protection.<sup>2582</sup> The new programme aimed at carefully evacuating 3,800 refugees from Libya, as well as providing voluntary humanitarian return to 15,000 migrants still present in Libya.<sup>2583</sup> These migrants would be helped to return to their country of origin, where they will also be supported financially to reintegrate.<sup>2584</sup> Lastly, the programme will aid 14,000 individuals in need of international protection, mainly from Niger, Chad, Cameroon, and Burkina Faso.<sup>2585</sup>

On 28 February 2018, the European Commission and the UN Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs have announced a humanitarian aid package worth EUR 24 million for the Ukraine.<sup>2586</sup> The money will be spent on food, healthcare, and education for children.<sup>2587</sup>

On 28 February 2018, the EU reaffirmed its commitment towards Palestinian refugees. The commitment occurred in light of the financial crisis experienced by the UN Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees in the Near East (UNRWA).<sup>2588</sup> As such, the EU hoped that a reaffirmation of its support would result in an increased donor base and comprehensive reform of the UNRWA.<sup>2589</sup>

The European Union has taken action to address the distinct needs of migrants both within Europe and abroad through a number of programmes and initiatives, including the EU-Turkey refugee deal and multiple partnership programs with international organizations such as the IOM and UNHCR.

Thus, the European Union receives a score of +1.
